A Life Changing Experience

My visit to Dunkirk Refugee Camp

here are events in your life that change you completely. They are marked in your memory like road signs on a highway. And once you experience them you are never the same. I experienced one of those life changing events in Dunkirk France.

While preaching in England at Newbold College, a pastor at the church invited me to go with him on an adventure to a refugee camp in France. Now I had never been to France and so I did not need convincing. But to go to a refugee camp only sparked my interest further. Upon arriving at the camp my curiosity turned

to concern and my concern turned to compassion.

To see humans living the way the refugees were and to hear their stories was life changing. Many had walked for months from Iran and Iraq and Syria across the continent to seek asylum in western Europe. But for some there journey was not over. Their goal was to cross the channel into England and to do that they tried to steal away on trains, hide under the axels of trucks, praying not to be caught. And though many we caught and returned, they only prepared to do it the next night.

The most powerful encounter we had was with the christians at the camp, many of whom felt unsafe because of holding to their christian faith on a mostly muslim populated camp. We sat in the cramped quarters of their modest cabins and shared our love for Christ. I was amazed as I watched them pull bibles from under pillows and mattresses. When I was there to strengthen them, I found that their faith was a strength to me.

I ask you to join me in prayer for the all of the refugees, especially the christians on Dunkirk Refugee Camp. But I also pray that their faith will challenge yours as it most definitely challenged mine.

Gaining Perspective on the Renovation:

"I don't want to do this anymore!" This was the thought I had entering our renovation committee meeting on the third week of October. The sentiment was birthed of frustration stemming from 2 long weeks of work deadlines, little sleep, and...a stalled renovation.

I settled in for the meeting, shared a devotional thought, and opened the floor for discussion. To that point, I had been prepared to share with the team my frustrations with how little we had been able to accomplish with the renovation recently... but God had other plans.

Pastor Chandler shared with the group a book he was reading called "The One Thing" that deals with focusing on accomplishing one's goals. He also shared that he was learning the importance of taking a step back and showing appreciation for accomplishments. In that moment, the conversation shifted as we began to recall

all the projects we tackled over the last two years and how far we had truly come. In the confines of the Youth room...observing the painted walls, newly installed floors, club seats, upgraded electrical switches... my mood began to change.

Church family, let me be the first to tell you that we are not as far along in the renovation as we would like to be. But at this time, I'd like to share with you how far we've come. Over the course of two years, we have seen many changes to our church building, both large and small. Here are the highlights:

- Upgraded the sanctuary audio system. This also included removing the hazardous exposed wires in the balcony.
- Refreshed the sanctuary lobby with new paint and modern light fixtures. Stay tuned for more improvements to the lobby in the coming months.





































- Installed new ADA compliant drinking fountains in the hallway. I'm sure many of our children are thankful they no longer accidentally run into the old ones!
- Installed new doors in all the children's classrooms, secondary bathrooms, church office, and Associate Pastor's office.
- Removed the popcorn ceilings in the (fellowship-side) hallways and classrooms.
- Painted all the classrooms, church office, and Associate Pastor's office.
- Installed a new moveable partition between the Kindergarten and Junior classrooms.
- Installed new flooring in the classrooms
- Installed new cabinetry in the Cradle Roll, Kindergarten, and Junior classrooms.
- Completed mold remediation in the classrooms and community service room.
- Re-wired each classroom to mount flat screen TVs.
- Upgraded electrical switches and receptacles in the classrooms and hallways.

 $W_{e \ kicked \ off \ the \ 2016 \ Year \ of \ Service}$ with more than 50 Capitol City SDA Church family members walking in the **Martin Luther King March for the Dream**. We marched alongside 28,000 community members and organizations from Sacramento region and beyond.

Our Church Family pledged 10,000 Hours of Community Service for 2016, to offer Acts of Kindness, volunteer individually in our own neighborhoods as well as with Church Family on Sidewalk Sabbaths.

After a lot of determination and hard work, **Community Services** reopened their food pantry doors under the leadership of Bro. Tim White and Bro. Morven Liburd. The food pantry is opened on Mondays from 10:00 - 1:00 (closed holidays and the first Monday of the month) and serves approximately 120 families per month. Community Services is an integral part of the SDA Church, it is the place our community reaches out to on a weekly basis.

April also launched our first **Sidewalk** Sabbath. Each fifth Sabbath (April 30, July 30, Oct 29) 150 plus Capitol City SDA Church family members and friends volunteered, as a team, at various locations, including: Salvation Army's Center of Hope Shelter, Citadel Center, Family Services Distribution Center, Transition Living Center, Capitol City SDA Fellowship Hall, Gramercy Court Nursing Home, Loaves and Fishes, and VA Medical Center.

Volunteers served hot meals and visited with those who had nowhere else to go. Sorted canned food, built and packed food boxes, donated over 100 items of men's clothing, dress shirts, t-shirts, pants, suits, shoes and socks, visited elderly in nursing home and veterans in the hospital. Volunteers spruced up buildings by painting doors and walls, and gardening.

The Gifts Project was started. Neck warmers, scripture pills, and encouragement cards were made for family and friends, and visitor welcome cards with blue sachets were made for guests that worship with us. Free treats were provided to passerbys at the ice cream stand and free popsicles were delivered to George Sims baseball field.

Health and Wellness Community Fair with free Farmer's Market and Veteran's Day Thank You Reception with Art and Photo Exhibit were also part of the year of service. We donated 150 thank you lapel pins to the Fresno Veteran's Day Parade. We also hosted an Advanced Funeral Planning seminar with a catered lunch. During the Year of Service, our church established a remarkable relationship with **Elder Creek Elementary School** on Lemon Hill. (See article on page 8-9.)

Throughout the year, many of you volunteered time helping others on your own, cooking a meal for family or friends who were sick or lost loved ones, provided a ride to someone who needed one, Acts of Kindness, no matter how small the deed it all was an important part of our year of service.

We end the year with two special events, Angel Tree Banquet providing gifts to low income families and our first Drive Thru Live Nativity. With 64+ still actors, scene leaders, scene builders, traffic controllers, pastors, elders, musicians, singers, artist, seamstress, cooks, and many hours of preparation. The ultimate community service projects for the year, ministries, church family, friends, and other churches, volunteering together to share the birth and love of Christ.

All in all, it was a good year. Some things worked really well, other times not so well, but through it all, the purpose was the same. To serve God. Health and Wellness Community Fair 2016:

Sharing the Love of God through bits and pieces of our health message.

apitol City Seventh-day Adventist (SDA) Church Missions Ministry ✓ focuses on providing opportunities for members to serve the community and church family throughout the year but with a special outreach ministry each 5th Saturday. The October 29, 2016 Sidewalk Sabbath focused on hosting a Health and Wellness Community Fair in collaboration with the Health and Temperance Ministry team. This would be the church's 2nd annual health fair. Our joint mission was to show our church family and community that we not only care about their spiritual needs, but their physical health and wellbeing.

The journey started off with the health team and several other church members canvassing the community to survey the needs of the community as well as to offer medical services. The team had a wonderful and exciting time going door to door, meeting the community, taking blood

pressures, diabetes checks, talking with the community about their various needs and praying with those who requested prayer. As a result, God touched 9 individuals' hearts who requested Bible studies. In addition, the needs survey added new ideas for church ministry as a whole.

As the date of the health fair approached, the missions ministry with a team of 30 volunteers lead a month long door to door crusade canvassing over 2500 homes in the Lemon Hill area. Posters were displayed at surrounding elementary, junior high and high schools, community centers, churches, and Sacramento works, as well as online.

The health ministry teams, throughout the year, has focused on opportunities to provide awareness of health care needs through early detection, education, prevention and the engagement of physical activities and life style change. With enthusiasm and excitement vendors were signed up to meet these goals for our second annual health fair.

This year a more diverse group of vendors were in attendance. The vendors ranged from a pregnancy van to a nutritionist to an audiologist who worked in partnership with California Telephone Access program to give free phones to the hearing impaired. Among our vendors was our very own Maple Avery who was able to share her passion for essential oils with us. I hope all were able to try her delicious editable lemon essential oil cupcakes.

For many of our neighbors, it was the first time they enter our church doors. They were greeted warmly, visited information booths, completed health screenings, and got a relaxing massage. Some sat and had lunch with our church family, while others were prayed for. Our guests also enjoyed the Community Services free Farmer's Market.

The day was also filled with seminars from Weimar and other vendors. The seminars included how to deal with depression, heart disease and diabetes, as well as helpful tips on eating a proper, whole food diet from a nutritionist.

We serviced 100 attendees throughout the day. They very much appreciated the health fair, and almost all requested to be contacted for future events. The following comments were shared:

Several vendors shared their enjoyment of the intimate setting as it allowed them to spend more time with participants.

Thank you to all who supported and volunteered for our second annual health fair.










Elder Creek Elementary School: A growing relationship!

he Elder Creek Elementary Garden was suppose to be part of the first Sidewalk Sabbath on April 30, but was postponed to a later date. Although delayed in our sight, on God's calendar everything was right on time. Elder Creek Garden became the catalyst for many volunteer projects.

It all began with a simple question Pastor Chandler asked Principal Doan of Elder Creek Elementary School "*Is there anything* our church can do for your school?" Several months later the answer was "yes, we need help with a garden"



The garden boxes initially were to be placed on the east side of the school, but Sis Dorothy Shelby, who volunteered to help with



the garden, in her wisdom asked for another location with more direct sun. Several weeks later Jamie called and said "I found something, but I'm not sure if you want to use it".

Sis. Shelby stated "looks like these weeds reach to China."

It took a few hours but the weeds that went to China were pulled up.

school students watered the boxes until August, then the grounds keeper watered the boxes. Because there was no time to watch seeds start to grow we transplanted; 2 Tomato, 1 Pepper, 1 Eggplant, 1 Basil, plants.

When school resumed in September, these plants were harvested and given to the new students.

Fall Garden - Taught cultivation, garden prep, weeding, adding nutrients, composting and worms. Determined when plants will be expected to mature and discussed nutritional values.

Planted were peas, radishes, onions, chard, lettuce, and carrots. Kids loved to dig in



This has proved to be one of the strangest gardens I have ever experienced. The garden was started three weeks before school was out for the summer. Two or three summer

dirt, water and plants seeds...way too many seeds. Transplanted were 3 cabbage, 3 broccoli, 3 cauliflower and 3 kale.






